Universities play a crucial role in sustainability transition, and students, staff and academics world-wide are pushing towards changes at their institutions. However, the speed of change is not fast enough, compared to the short time frame humanity has to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, halt biodiversity loss and restore ecosystems and move from a linear to a circular economy.

It is increasingly recognized that isolated attempts by individual students, departments or professors will not bring about the required changes. On the contrary, a move towards collective action is required, drawing on the talents and energy of students, staff, academics and external stakeholders. In addition, projects and organisational structures need to be explored and found that can help to promote whole-institution approaches, linking sustainability activities in education, research, operations and community.

We invited exciting speakers from the Netherlands, Germany and the United Kingdom to discuss with us the following question: How can we create dynamic processes to accelerate sustainability transitions at universities? Join us for a vibrant discussion!
